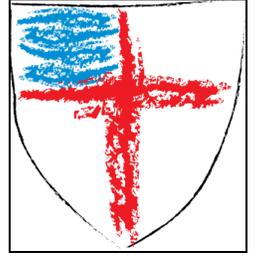

Spiritual Reflection: *(This is a very long article and I have shortened it to the first of several headings. It is located at <https://www.tomorrowworld.org/magazines/2010/may-june/the-spirit-of-pentecost> so you may read the entire article.*

“God gave the Holy Spirit to His Church on the Day of Pentecost, but few understand the meaning of this Holy Day. God's Holy Spirit is vital for true Christian living, but many are unaware of what it is, what Pentecost is, and what it means to Christians today!”

Do you feel the Spirit of God moving in your life? Can you be filled with the same Spirit of Pentecost as Christ's first disciples? Yes, you can!

It had been an unforgettable 50 days for Christ's disciples. Their Teacher had come back from the dead after a brutal execution, and had taught them for 40 days. More than 500 at one time had seen Him ([1 Corinthians 15:6](#)). The disciples ate with Him, talked with Him and even touched the wounds where His body had been pierced.

But that was not all. After 40 dramatic days of instruction, the Savior ascended into the clouds, while His disciples watched with wonder and amazement. But He did not leave them alone—He promised to give them something that would empower them with spiritual vitality they had never before experienced ([Luke 24:49](#)).

The disciple Luke describes Christ's encouraging words. "And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, 'which,' He said, 'you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now'" ([Acts 1:4–5](#)).

What event was the risen Christ speaking of? What was this "promise" to come? Most Bible students know the basic story, but many are not fully aware of the profound impact this momentous 50th day would have on the Church of God from that point forward. It was the day of Pentecost—the day of miracles—the day the New Testament Church began!

The rest of the reflection talks about: The Day the Church Began; Why they kept Pentecost; How to keep Pentecost; What we must do:

(Final paragraph) This Pentecost, ask yourself if you are truly obeying God in everything you do. Ask yourself if you are submitting to your Lord and Master in thought, word and deed! And ask yourself if you are being obedient in *keeping holy the Holy Days that God ordained*. True Christians *can* obey God from the heart, more deeply than they

An opportunity to do a good thing!

Although Wamego churches have been involved with the fundraiser formerly know as the “Walk for Warmth” for many years, our enthusiasm has a community event seems to have waned. Here is some history that I remember involving the transition of the fund-gathering process to feed the hungry since the Elcock family has lived in Wamego. Wamego held the CROP (Christian Rural Oversea Program) walk each year. After many years and an energy crisis, and the need to help local individuals with rising utility bills, the walk changed to the Walk for Warmth. The Council of Churches was involved in sponsoring this annual event and St. Luke’s has had their turn through the years organizing it. As the need to held people locally grew, the Community Health Ministry (CHM) was started and has grown into the “star” local community service agency in the state. A few years ago the Council of Churches decided to partner with the CHM to sponsor the annual Walk. The name changed to Walk for Warmth and Wellness. The walk organizer rotates from church to church and this year Trinity is in charge but we at St Luke’s are also involved. This “Walk” raises money for CHM that is earmarked for medication and utility and rent assistance in the area served by CHM. This is the only money raised for this vital need.

Support this year is down as noted by decreased registration. Trinity has challenged the churches to have 10 walkers/runners each. Doug and I have pledged to pay \$5.00 of the registration fee for each person who will register to walk or run. Jack Kaine will also add \$5.00 to each registration. This allows the kids to walk nearly free. How about the rest of you?
